At the same time, aim of planting tree is to restore native forests around village to protect water supplies. We have endeavoured to preach that Planting of trees is a holy act. One tree is equated to 10 children. Students have been made aware of the urgency of planting trees because

It reduces carbon dioxide, a principal greenhouse gas that contributes to global warming. Planting tree increases oxygen level in environment, the most essential gas on globe. When one plants a tree, one is creating habitat for other species. One is starting a food source for human and animals. One is stabilising soil to prevent erosion. One is creating natural water filters.

Preparation-

- Take special care when transporting plants from the nursery.
- The proper vehicle, a truck or trailer, can reduce the risk of injury from loading and unloading.
- Protect leaves and needles from the sun and wind by wrapping or covering while in transit.
- Cushion stems and branches from injury.
- Always tie the plants down securely and avoid high speed travel.

Successful planting starts with proper site preparation.

- Digging the hole for a new plant is the first step.
- The hole should be at least 1-2 feet wider than the size of the root system (except for direct tree spade planted trees).
- Make the hole as wide or wider at the bottom than at the top.
- A larger hole will allow for better root growth, especially in poor soil .Roughen the sides of the hole with a shovel. Planting depth is critical.
- Never put rocks or gravel in the bottom of the hole to improve drainage unless it is connected to a drain tile

Dr M.M. Wagh said that Dhodap is one of the hill forts in Maharashtra state in India. Situated in Kalwan taluka in the Nashik district. the fort is 4829 ft (1472 MT) above sea level. It is the site of the second-highest fort in the Sahyadri mountains after Salher. Dhodap hill is the third-highest peak in Maharashtra after Kalsubai and Salher and the 29th highest peak in Western Ghats. The top of the fort was built using a combination of dressed stone and brickwork. There is a tank with an idol of Lord Hanuman and a tunnel 5m wide. The fort has a pointed cliff named Shembi. One can find caves at the base. One end of the fort shows a domical structure. The eastern face shows a fearsome cliff named Ikhara which is ideal for rock climbers .Dr. Nitin Jadhav This fort is a good site for trekkers and adventurous tourists to visit. Accommodation can be arranged at the base village with the help of local villagers. Enough drinking Water is available at the top. However, carry enough water while climbing this fort During his return from the second raid on Surat (1670 CE), Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj visited this fort, presumably for keeping the treasure. A few days later, the Battle of Dindori took place between the Maratha and Mughal forces. The fort played an important role during the Peshwa period. Raghobadada Peshwa hatched a plot against Madhavrao Peshwa here.

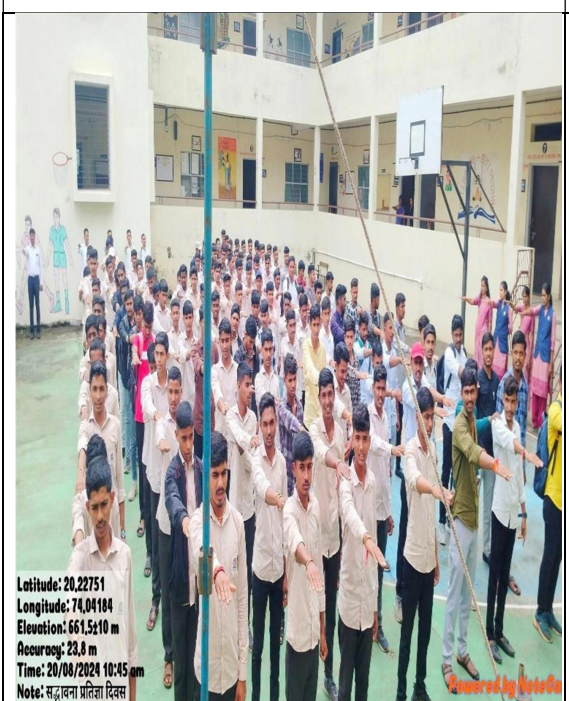

Principal I/C of the college has been asked to form a Committee on Plantation comprising Responsible Employees of the college to keep the record of the photos in an album year – wise and to submit Annual Report on Plantation after admission process

Spring is a great time of year to plant trees and shrubs. The timing enables roots to grow into the surrounding soil before stress due to new foliage growth and high temperatures occurs.

3)The location of the planting site in relation to other trees and objects such as buildings, fences, etc. will affect temperature and moisture conditions. Prevailing westerly winds will have a drying effect on non-protected sites. The south side of a building will be much warmer and drier than

the north side. The warming effect of the sun on a cold winter day can cause injury to the bark and may cause the tree trunk to split. For evergreens, this warming can cause water loss and needle damage when the temperature is again lowered. The amount of protection provided by individual microclimates can affect plant hardiness.
